• Status on workgroups and networks

Courses at university level
 At the moment, the work on a common Nordic education has remained a bit in the background. But, Høgskolan Sørøst will start a module called "Diversity in Communication" in January 2019 and parts of this module can be done as distance learning. The goal is to become Nordic in the future.

Methods for identification of people with deafblindness There is a need to identify people with deafblindness

There is a need to identify people with deafblindness and Maria will have a meeting with members from different Nordic countries in 2018. NVC will outline a project for a potential future working group that would look into the issue concerning methods of identification. NVC will pay for travels and accommodations for the Nordic participants. The co-workers and leaders are: Johan Granli Karlsvärd from Sweden, Helle Buelund Selling from Denmark, Britta Nilsson from Norway, Estella Björnsson from Iceland and Taru Kaaja from Finland. The group will introduce a project plan suggestion in December 2018. NVC will investigate the possibility to obtain external project founds.

Networks

The reports from the networks were available at the event site ahead of the meeting. Currently, there are four Nordic networks.

- o *The CHARGE network:* leaders expect a written report after every meeting in the network. The network will have a live seminar, in Oslo, November 7th.
- The Cognition Network: members of the network are writing a book with expected release in 2019.



- The network on Communicative Relations
 The network is planning a course in March 2019.
- o *The Tactile Linguality Network:* The network is writing a book that is expected to be released in December 2018. The network will have a live seminar, in Oslo, December 5th.

We discussed the importance of spreading knowledge from the networks in to the field.
